





Installation

The FGR-30D supports installation on DIN rails with 35 mm x 15 mm and 35 mm x 7.5 mm sizes. The minimum mounting distance between the FGR-30D and other systems with similar heat radiation characteristics is 100 mm.


1. Connect the DIN rail bracket to the device using the provided bracket screws.




2. Position the device directly in front of the DIN rail, ensuring that the top of the DIN rail bracket hooks over the top of the DIN rail.



3. Rotate the device until the bottom of the DIN rail bracket sits against the bottom of the DIN rail.




